## Oil PSUs' Output from Overseas Fields Up a Tad



New Delhi: India's state-run firms' output from overseas oil and gas fields marginally rose in 2023-24 after declining for four straight years.

The output, however, remained a fifth below the peak of 2018-19 as producing fields matured and no new overseas as-

ars. The share of India's state companies in oil and gas pro-duction from overseas fields increased to 19.9 million metric tonnes of oil equivalent (MMTOE) in 2023-24 from 19.5

MMTOE in the previous year. Production at Russia's Ska-halin-1 project normalised during the financial year, after being badly affected in



2022 following the launch of the Russia-Ukraine war. ONGC Videsh, India's lar-

gest investor in overseas oil and gas fields, has a stake in Sakhalin-1, where produc-tion had nearly halted for so-

me time following the exit of its operator Exxon, industry executives said.

Similarly, production at ONGC Videsh's two projects in South Sudan, which were shut by unprecedented floods previously, resumed in 2023-24, the executives said.

Voluntary production cuts by OPEC+ countries, led by Saudi Arabia and Russia, also affect Indian firms' overse-

Russia, UAE, Azerbaijan and South Sudan are mem-bers of OPEC+, a grouping of about two dozen oil-produ-cing countries that jointly coordinate oil production and have been producing less

than their capacity.

firms. Big invest-ments in Rus-sian fields in 2015-16 helped boost Indian firms' overse-

as output in the past decade. India's overseas output surged two and a half times to 24.7 MMTOE in 2018-19 from 9.9 MMTOE in 2014-15. The output started declining

in 2019-20, falling every year un-til 2022-23, as fields matured. Indian firms also slowed down on acquiring assets after the purchases in Russia and the UAE seven-eight years ago. Some of the exploration and

Some of the exploration and discovered assets they had acquired previously haven't started production.

The giant gas field in Mozambique, where ONGC, BPCL and Oil India have invested, is stuck due to the poor law and order situation.

## कच्चे तेल की प्रोसेसिंग में हुआ इजाफा

नई दिल्ली। भारत का पेट्रोलियम परिशोधन मार्च में बढ़कर 2.34 करोड़ टन हो गया। पेट्रोलियम योजना व विश्लेषण प्रकोष्ठ जारी आंकड़ों के मुताबिक पेट्रोलियम परिशोधन मार्च 2024 में बीते साल की इस अवधि की तुलना में 1.6 प्रतिशत अधिक हुआ। मार्च 2023 में पेट्रोलियम परिशोधन 2.3 करोड़ टन था। हालांकि इस साल फरवरी में 2.09 करोड़ टन का शोधन हुआ था। लिहाजा फरवरी की तुलना में मार्च में क्रमिक आधार पर मात्रा में १ १.९ प्रतिशत का इजाफा हुआ। मार्च में कुल प्रसंस्कृत मात्रा में सरकार के स्वामित्व वाले सार्वजनिक क्षेत्र के उद्यम और संयुक्त उपक्रमों की हिस्सेदारी 1.61 करोड़ टन थी जबकि निजी रिफाइनरियों ने 73 लाख दन कच्चे तेल का परिशोधन किया। नवीनतम माह में भी घरेलू कच्चे तेल का परिशोधन 25 लाख टन के उत्पादन पर स्थिर था। हालांकि मार्च बीते साल मार्च की की तुलना में इस वर्ष के मार्च में कच्चे तेल का आयात 4.4 प्रतिशत गिरकर २० अरब डॉलर हो गया।

# TN to launch trial of LNG buses in Chennai, aims to cut fuel costs

TAMIL NADU transport department is set to launch the trial of two buses powered by Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) in Chennai soon. The Villupuram division of the Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation (TNSTC) will introduce one bus on a mofussil route and the Metropolitan Transport Corporation (MTC) will deploy another on a city route.

If the trial is successful, the project can be expanded enabling the eight cash-strapped transport corporations to cut fuel expenses compared to conventional diesel buses while offering commuters more comfortable travel.

Following approval from the state government, TNSTC (Villupuram) and MTC have been allocated one bus each for conversion from diesel to LNG.

Official sources told *TNIE*the conversion of buses to LNG is currently underway in Villupuram and Chennai. "Our current target for diesel mileage is

5.7km per litre, but we have achieved around 5.68km so far. We have also been informed that travel comfort would be improved with LNG. Only after completing the trial can we determine if it is truly feasible for large-scale bus operations," said an official from TNSTC (Villupuram). The official added that pollution levels of LNG

buses are less compared to diesel buses.

As per industry sources, an LNG bus can cover approximately 850-900km with a 180-kg cryogenic tank filled to full capacity. However, this can vary depending on the number of commuters transported on each trip.

"The transport corporations could not maintain the mileage of 5.7km per litre of diesel due to overcrowding of buses during peak hours. Factors including road conditions, crowding and other maintenance expenses will also be considered during trial," the official noted.

stood at ₹16,985 crore, with fuel
costs alone constituting 28.35%
of it, at ₹5,194.68 crore. Fuel
costs accounted for 15-18% of
total expenses during FY 201819. Moreover, during FY 202223, the average daily loss incurred by all eight transport
corporations in the state stood
at ₹15 crore. P5
