

HRD Ministry sets up panel to discuss when NEET, JEE exams can be conducted

UNION HRD Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal on Thursday announced that a committee has been set up to review the prevailing situation of the Covid-19 pandemic and the safety of examinations under the circumstances which will deliberate when the much-awaited NEET and JEE tests can take place.

This committee, with DG National Testing Agency and other experts as its members, is to submit its recommendations to the HRD Minister by Friday, after which a final announcement will be made.

"I have been continuously receiving requests and representations from students taking the JEE and NEET examinations through social media, emails and various platforms of the HRD Ministry, that considering the present circumstances, the examinations should be postponed a little. On the basis of these requests, I had asked DG NTA and his team to look into the matter and take into account all factors of the situation and report back to me tomorrow latest. Our priority is the safety of the students who will be taking the examinations. The Committee will recommend how and when the exams can take place," Pokhriyal said on Thursday.

As many as 9 lakh candidates have registered to take the JEE (Main), and approximately 16 lakh have registered for NEET.

Students across the country have been protesting against holding exams at this time, demanding NEET and JEE be postponed. If the committee decision is to postpone the examinations further, it will further push back the entrance of fresh students in to higher education institutions and the beginning of classes for first year students. The indicative calendar issued by the University Grants Commission in April had proposed the new academic calendar for the fresh batch to commence in the first week of September.

The postponement of JEE (Main) will furthermore push back the dates of JEE (Advanced) as candidates aspiring for JEE (Advanced) will first have to clear the JEE (Main).

The HRD Ministry had earlier deferred all competitive exams scheduled in April, May and June due to the nationwide lockdown.

On May 5, the Ministry announced that the JEE (Main) - the gateway exam for admission to NITs - will be held over five days between July 18 and July 23. The Ministry further announced that the NEET exam for undergraduate medical programmes will be held on July 26.

TN: Four die of asphyxiation while cleaning septic tank

FOUR YOUTHS cleaning a septic tank in Tamil Nadu's Thoothukudi district died of asphyxiation on Thursday.

The police said the incident happened at a house in Chekkarakudi, a village about 40 km west of Thoothukudi town.

Pandi (24), Isakiraja (20), Bala (23), and Dinesh (20) hailed from the neighbouring Tirunelveli district. They had been engaged in the work since morning. At noon, one of them fainted inside the septic tank. "After that, the others too entered the tank one by one and managed to take him outside. While people rushed him to a hospital, the three others also fainted," said a police officer.

A fire and rescue team was alerted, but, by the time they arrived, the three had died. The youth taken to the hospital was declared brought dead.

The bodies were taken to Thoothukudi Government Medical College for a post-mortem exam. The house owner was booked and a probe is on.

CBI books GVK over Mumbai airport, says funds diverted for personal use

THE CBI has booked GVK Airports Holdings and its Chairman G V K Reddy for allegedly causing a loss of Rs 705 crore to the Airports Authority of India (AAI) by siphoning off funds and using them for personal purposes and to fund own group companies.

GVK Airports Holdings is the operator of the Mumbai international airport through Mumbai International Airport Ltd (MIAL), a joint venture between the AAI and GVK.

The CBI on Thursday conducted searches at two locations, in Mumbai and Hyderabad, in connection with the case. Sources said, based on the CBI FIR, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) would soon register a case of money laundering against the promoters of the company.

The ANI released a statement by MIAL, saying, it was "surprised to note registration of case by CBI against MIAL & others. MIAL would have pro-

vided every assistance had the agency sought explanation or any document even if a preliminary enquiry had been initiated".

In its FIR, the CBI has made four sets of allegations against the GVK group. These include: "siphoning of funds by executing bogus work contracts, misusing the reserves and surplus funds of MIAL, inflating the expenditure of MIAL by diverting

the funds, and under-reporting MIAL revenue by entering into related party contracts and meeting the personal expenses of promoters".

Apart from G V K Reddy, the CBI has booked his son G V Sanjay Reddy, who is the MD of GVK Airports Holdings; MIAL; an unknown official of the AAI; and nine companies - some of them owned by Reddy's relatives - which allegedly benefited from

either bogus contracts or preferential allotment of commercial activity at low rates.

According to the CBI, around 200 acres of land around Mumbai airport was given to MIAL by the AAI for development and generating revenue. However, MIAL entered into "fake/bogus contracts during 2017-18" with nine different companies "on the pretext of real estate development".

The CBI has alleged that "MIAL transferred the funds but these contracts have never been executed on ground and the transactions were only on paper". In this way, the CBI has said, GVK siphoned off Rs 310 crore and the nine companies even fraudulently claimed input tax credit. The CBI has said there are more such companies, which it is probing.

The CBI has alleged GVK also misused Rs 395 crore of MIAL's surplus funds by opening FDRs in PSU banks at Hyderabad and using them "for the benefit of GVK group companies". They also used these funds to avail of loans and overdraft facility from

PSU banks, the CBI has said. According to the CBI, GVK also caused over Rs 100 crore loss to MIAL by shifting its employees onto MIAL payrolls even though they were actually not working for MIAL.

Explaining how the Reddy family made gains for itself, the CBI has said, "...they assigned the premium retail area of Mumbai Airport to companies owned by their family members / relatives / employees at exorbitantly low rates, thereby reducing the revenue of MIAL on account of earnings in the form of rental and sales. Some of these companies are M/s Rockline Solutions Pvt Ltd, M/s International Airport Hotels & Resorts Pvt Ltd etc".

The GVK group thus abused the agreement with the AAI and misused funds "by entering into agreements (with a company owned by family members) employees to book train, air travel tickets and hotel booking for all the personal as well as the group employees of GVK who are not connected with the affairs of MIAL", the CBI has said.

RECOVERY OF DAMAGE TO PROPERTY DURING ANTI-CAA PROTESTS

UP announces auction of two sealed shops on July 16, attaches another

THE LUCKNOW administration on Thursday attached one more shop as part of its exercise to recover damages to public properties during the anti-CAA protests in the city last December. It also announced auction of the two shops it had attached and sealed two days ago.

"We have fixed July 16 as the date for auction of the two shops that were sealed Tuesday," Tehsildar (Sadar) Shambhu Sharan Singh said, adding that if the owners of the shops can pay the damages in the coming days, their properties will be opened and auction proceedings halted.

The two shops sealed earlier included a garment store - NY Fashion Centre - and a junk shop

in Hasanganj. The junk shop owner, Maahenoor Choudhary, and the garment shop's assistant store manager, Dharamveer Singh, are among the 13 people who have been ordered to pay Rs 21.76 lakh for the destruction of public properties in Hasanganj police station area during the anti-CAA protests on December 19 last year. The order was issued by ADM (Trans-Gomti) Vishwa Bhushan Mishra on February 13, 2020, said the Tehsildar (Sadar).

A welding workshop, which was sealed on Thursday, is located in Khurram Nagar area of the city and belongs to one Mohammad Nafees. Nafees has been accused by the police of vandalism at Parivartan Chowk under Hazratganj police station during the December 19 protests against the new citizenship law and proposed NRC.

According to an order passed by ADM (East) KP Singh on February 17 this year, 28 people have been asked to pay for damages to properties worth Rs 63,37,637 in Hazratganj area.

A total of 57 people across four police stations have been served notices for the recovery of Rs 1.55-crore. In March, their photographs and addresses were displayed on hoardings across the city, triggering criticism from the courts.

Congress leader and social activist Sadaf Jafar (44), retired IPS officer SR Darapuri (77), and activist Mohammad Shoaib (73) are among the 57 people.

Following a suggestion from Allahabad High Court, the Lucknow administration on March 20 stopped all action such as attachment of properties and arrests taking into account the pandemic.

Will assess if holding CA exams is possible amid Covid surge: ICAI to SC

THE INSTITUTE of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) on Thursday told the Supreme Court that it will assess whether it was possible to hold the Chartered Accountancy exams scheduled between July 29 and August 16 given that Covid-19 cases are on the rise across the country.

The Institute told a bench of Justices A M Khanwilkar, Dinesh Maheshwari and Sanjeev Khanna that it will consult states as well as examination centres and apprise the court.

The ICAI counsel told the court that some states have extended restrictions in view of a surge in Covid-19 cases.

The bench allowed the request of the counsel for more time and fixed the matter for hearing next on July 10.

The top court was hearing through video conferencing a plea

challenging the 'opt out' option provided by the ICAI to the candidates on the ground that it "arbitrarily" discriminates between the aspirants.

Hearing the plea on June 29, the court had asked ICAI to extend its 'opt out' facility for candidates who are unable to take the exams on account of the Covid situation to all candidates who cannot make it, irrespective of whether they opted to remain out or not.

The bench also advised the institute to keep open the option for change in examination centre till the last week and not to freeze it as the situation is evolving.

Advocate Alakh Alok Srivastava, appearing for the petitioner, had earlier told the bench that number of examination centres should be increased and there should be one centre per district.

The ICAI had expressed difficulty on this and told the court that over 500 examination centres have been identified and sanitized properly.

NIA arrests Budgam man for 'transporting Pulwama bomb maker'

THE NATIONAL Investigation Agency (NIA) on Thursday made its sixth arrest in the February 2019 Pulwama attack case.

Budgam resident Mohammed Iqbal Rather was arrested by NIA for allegedly transporting Pakistani bomb-maker Mohammed Umer from the Jammu border to Pulwama.

Umer and his associates allegedly fitted a bomb in a car that was driven by Kakpora resident Adil Ahmed Dar and exploded near a CRPF bus, killing 40 personnel, on February 14, 2019.

Sources said Rather was arrested in September last year in connection with a Jaish-e-Mohammed conspiracy case. He was lodged in jail, from where the NIA took him into custody in the Pulwama case after evidence surfaced that he played a part in transporting the Pulwama bombmaker.

"Mohd. Iqbal Rather had facilitated the movement of Muhammad Umar Farooq, the JeM terrorist and a key conspirator in this case, after he infil-

trated into the Indian territory in Jammu region in April, 2018, from the National Highway near International border to South Kashmir. Mohd. Umar Farooq, along with others, had assembled the IED used in the attack," the NIA said in a statement.

According to NIA, initial examination has revealed that "Mohd. Iqbal Rather was in constant touch with Pakistan-based leadership of Jaish-e-Mohammed and was in communication with them over secure messaging applications. Mohd. Iqbal Rather was part of the 'transportation module' of Jaish-e-Mohammed terrorist organisation."

Rather was first arrested on September 26 when he was travelling with his associates Imtiyaz Ahmad Nengroo and Riyaz Nengroo on Jammu-Pathankot highway. They were suspected of aiding transport of JeM terrorists on a regular basis.
