भारतीय नौसेना और तटरक्षक बल ने श्रीलंका की नौसेना के साथ तेल लदे टैंकर की आग बुझाकर पर्यावरण से जुड़े बड़े खतरे को टाल दिया। पोत पर इंडियन ऑयल कार्पोरेशन (आईओसी) द्वारा किराए पर लिया गया तेल से भरा सुपर टैंकर लदा था।

शोधः केजी बेसिन मिथेन ईंधन का उत्कृष्ट स्रोत

केंद्र सरकार के विज्ञान एवं प्रौद्योगिकी मंत्रालय के तहत काम करने वाले आगरकर अनुसंधान संस्थान (एआरआई) द्वारा किए गए एक शोध के मुताबिक कृष्णा-गोदावरी (केजी) बेसिन में मिथेन हाइड्रेट का विशाल भंडार है जो स्वच्छ ईंधन का स्त्रोत है।

मरीन जीनोमिक्स नाम के जर्नल में प्रकाशन के लिए स्वीकार किया गया यह अध्ययन कहता है कि मिथेन स्वच्छ और कम लागत वाला ईंधन है और ऐसा आकलन है कि एक घन मीटर मिथेन हाइड्रेट में 160-180 घन मीटर मिथेन होती है। एआरआई द्वारा किए अध्ययन

के मुताबिक, केजी बेसिन में मिथेन हाइड्रेट्स में मौजूद मिथेन का कम से कम आकलन भी करें तो यह दुनिया में मौजूद कुल जीवाश्म ईंधन का दोगुना है। मिथेन के जलने की स्वच्छ प्रक्रिया इसे आकर्षक ईंधन बनाती है। ऑक्सीजन की मौजूदगी में जलाने पर इसका एक अणु पानी के दो अणु और कॉर्बन डाई ऑक्साइड का एक अणु छोड़ता है।

Petrol price was for the first time cut in six months on September 10 when rates were reduced by 9 paise a litre.

Diesel price fell to Rs 72.93 per litre in the national Capital from Rs 73.05.

Diesel rates had seen their first reduction since mid-March on September 3. Since then, rates have fallen by 63 paise.

On September 3, the first reduction in diesel price happened since mid-March when Indian Oil Corp (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corp Limited (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corp Limited (HPCL) froze rates for 82 days to adjust a record hike in excise duty on auto fuels against falling benchmark cost.

Diesel rates had gone up by Rs 12.55 a litre between June 7, when oil firms resumed revising prices in line with cost, and July 25. Diesel price has remained unchanged in the country since July 25, except in Delhi where a reduction in VAT lowered the rate by Rs 8.38 per litre.

Petrol price went up by Rs 9.17 per litre between June 7 and June 29 before hitting a pause. The revision cycle again started on August 16 and rates have gone up by Rs 1.51 since then. In all, the petrol price has risen by Rs 10.68 since June 7.

State-owned fuel retailers revise rates of petrol and diesel daily based on the average price of benchmark fuel in the preceding 15 days.

Fuel demand falls again after hope in July

India's fuel demand is showing signs of stress with a sharp fall in August, the biggest monthly decline since April when the Covid-related lockdown brought economic activity to a standstill.

Coronavirus surge continues in the country and at local levels lockdowns continue affecting a real pick up in economic activity.

nomic activity.

The sales of petroleum products (refined products such as petrol, diesel, ATF etc) have registered a 16 per cent decline to 14.39 million tonnes in August this year as compared to the same month last year.

The fall is also over previous month of July at 7.5 per cent, data from the Petroleum Planning and Analysis Cell (PPAC) of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas showed. This is the sharpest fall in demand since April.

What is worrisome is the sale of diesel has also fallen in August. Diesel is considered a barometer of economic activity in the country and accounts for about 40 per cent of overall sales of petroleum products.

Diesel consumption, fell
by about 12 per cent to 4.85
million tonnes in August from
5.51 million tonnes in July.

The decline has also been witnessed in the case of petrol which fell by 7.4 per cent from a year earlier to 2.38 million tonnes. However, petrol sales have risen 5.3 per cent from 2.26 million tonnes in July, as the Unlock phase and continued restrictions on public transport have pushed up use of personal vehicles.
