Circular No. 26/2018-Cum-IMMM Amendment 36/2018

No: MAT/PMC/13(220)/2018 Dated: 28.05.2018

Sub: Quality and Cost based selection (QCBS) and QCBS with Least Cost Selection (LCS).

Reference is invited to Circular No. 06/2015 dated 31.01.2015, whereby Integrated MM Manual was implemented in ONGC. Provisions under para 11.3 pertaining to procurement on Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS) were to be implemented after issuance of detailed guidelines in due course.

In the EPC meeting (06/2018) held on 07.03.2018 and 507th meeting of EC held on 9th & 10th March 2018, it has been decided that for procurement of critical nature of services, consultancy services (where scope of services cannot be drawn objectively) and where it can be justified, for meeting the requirement in an overall cost efficient manner, to adopt either Quality and Cost based selection (QCBS) or Least Cost Selection (LCS) with minimum qualifying marks.

Accordingly, in the aforesaid meeting of EPC and EC, following decisions have been taken with respect to evaluation of bids on QCBS and LCS basis:

(I) Least Cost Selection (LCS) of bids with minimum qualification score:

For selection of bids on LCS basis, minimum qualifying marks for quality of the technical proposal shall be prescribed as benchmark and indicated in the BEC/tender conditions along with a scheme for allotting marks for various technical criteria/attributes. Bidders scoring minimum technical qualifying marks shall be considered for price bid opening and L-1 among them shall be considered for award.

LCS shall be applicable for services which are characterized by high degree of technical influence and low value.

(II) Quality and Cost based selection (QCBS) of bids shall be adopted for procurement of following services:

The list of services approved above and the weightage (Technical: Price) shall be reviewed based on the experience gained during the implementation of the policy after one year.

Separate approval would be required to be taken in case of non-implementation of QCBS for the specified services.

- (III) Applicability of QCBS/LCS will be approved by a Committee of Directors (CoD) comprising of Director (Finance), Director-I/c MM and Director concerned. The weightage of respective technical parameters (QCBS/LCS matrix) shall be proposed by the Working Group at the work center duly recommended by the concerned Key Executive and put up by Chief MM for the approval of CoD.
- (IV) QCBS methodology shall be implemented while awarding contracts for procurement / hiring of all E&P services in future. Similar QCBS matrix be firmed up for charter hiring of drilling rigs and other E&P services. The QCBS matrix be firmed up by the working group for factoring in the practices being followed by ONGC Videsh and other PSUs in awarding contracts through QCBS methodology.
- (V) The security tenders which have already been invited with QCBS methodology shall be finalized based on the decision taken by EC in its 495th meeting.

- (VI) EC had in the past provided guidelines on the QCBS methodology. This supersedes earlier decision of EC on QCBS.
- (VII) Regular/Routine procurement characterized by low degree of technical influence shall continue to be procured as per existing practice, wherein bids are shortlisted for price bid opening as per standard qualification criteria of BEC for service contracts.

Accordingly, modified provisions for procurement on QCBS and LCS basis have been incorporated in IMMM as per enclosed Annexure-A.

Above guidelines should be meticulously followed by all concerned.
