2. CUDDALORE

1. A grant of Rs.1.60 lakh was sanctioned to Panchayat Union Primary School, Mannaveli towards provision of Mini water pump with borewell.

The school is situated in a village with a total student's strength of 22 children. The school was facing acute water shortage due to lack of sources to augment water. Under ONGC assistance Bore well is laid up to 150 feet, provision for syntax helped children in hand and lunch box washing. The school environment is clean and tidy with spacious classrooms.

2. Grant of Rs. 2.50 lakh was sanctioned to Government Higher Secondary school for girls, Bhuvanagiri towards purchase of furniture and renovation of toilet



The school has a total strength of 1397 students (from class VI to class 12). Out of 1397 students, 546 of them belong to schedule caste, 18 schedule tribes and 54 students belong to Muslim community. The ONGC fund was utilized for renovation of toilets by fixing tiles; construction of water tank, laying of new pipelines facilitated the students to use the toilets. The students expressed that they are satisfied with the facility and all of them are using the toilets. The management has engaged a care taker by paying Rs. 400 per month towards maintenance. The provision of furniture has helped student in better posture position and concentration on studies.

3. A grant of Rs. 3.25 lakh was sanctioned to Panchayat Union Middle School, Jakir Hussain Nagar, Lalpet towards construction of a compound wall.

The school has strength of 190 students (85+115). Majority of children belong to minority community (Muslim). The toilet facilities are sufficient. The community always contributes for the development of the school. The cost of construction of compound wall was Rs. 4, 04,298 of which ONGC contributed Rs. 3, 25,000. The students expressed that they were under fear because of the burial ground located

adjacent to the classrooms. Construction of compound wall had given them great relief. The completion report given by the headmistress was well appreciated by ONGC official and sent their appreciation to District Education Officer.

4. A grant of Rs. 1.60 lakh was sanctioned to an ICDS Centre, Boothavarayanpettai, Pinnalu towards mini water pump in the borewell.



The acute water problem in the village affected the Anganwadi centre. There was no protected and quality water available in the village. Due to ONGC assistance, a mini water pump was provided in ICDS Centre and at present, the ICDS children have access to safe drinking water. The water is used for cooking and for drinking purpose. The village consisting of 118 families fetches water through the bore well provided at the Anganwadi centre.

5. A grant of Rs. 2 lakhs was sanctioned to Panchayat Union Girls Middle School, Perumathur, Bhuvanagiri for construction of laboratory and computer room

The school has a strength of 163 students (from class I – class VIII) of which 123 children belong to scheduled caste. The class rooms are maintained neatly. The computer classes were conducted on shift basis in the regular classrooms.

The cost of building was estimated at Rs. 5lakhs. But ONGC has sanctioned only 2 lakhs. Hence, the building is still under construction stage. The unfinished work includes flooring, sea side walls and parapet walls. The headmaster has submitted requisition of Rs.2 lakhs to ONGC for completing the construction.

6. A grant of Rs. 64,350 was sanctioned to Panchayat Union Primary School, Thiruvallur Colony, Bhuvanagiri for providing grill gate

The school is located in an area which is inhabited by marginalized community. The school provides education up to V standard. The strength of the school is 30 of which SC children is 20 and ST is 5. the parents of the children expressed the quality

of the education is very good and hence, they prefer to send the children to this school rather than to private schools which offer English education.

There was no security due to lack of gate and children were faced with dog and cow menace. Children frequently went out of the school premises, resulting in disturbance in conducting the classes. The mothers expressed satisfaction and feel secure due to gate provided by ONGC.

7. A grant of Rs. 81,000 was sanctioned to Panchayat Union Middle school, Manjakolai towards school infrastructure (Changing of flooring)

The school has a total strength of 55 children, of which 47 children belong to Scheduled Caste. The classrooms were lacking cement floor resulting in uniforms getting dirty. The VLC and school management decided to approach ONGC for changing the floor to tiles. At present, the parents are satisfied with the infrastructure and children are looking neat with their uniforms.



8. A grant of Rs. 1.50 lakh was sanctioned to Panchayat Union Middle School, North Kolakkudi, Kattumannar Koil towards provision of borewell and water supply arrangements

The total students strength is 256, of which 163 children belongs to scheduled caste. existing toilets were not in use due to lack of water supply. There was shortage of drinking water supply, hence timely ONGC support was a boon to the children. The Village level committee had taken efforts to obtain grants from ONGC. Due to ONGC interventions in improving school infrastructure facilities, the school was adjudged as best school during 2013-14. The local community contributed an amount of Rs.22, 000/- in addition to ONGC assistance.

9. A grant of Rs.44, 368 was sanctioned to Middle School, Ambapuram, Chidambaram towards renovation of toilets



The school provides the education up to VIII standard. The school being an aided one motivates the parents for the enrollment of students every year. It was expressed that the school has ensured toilet facilities for girls, since most of them drop out due to lack of toilets during adolescent stage. ONGC assistance has ensured water facility, which has helped them to continue their school education. Prior to this support, the children used to go home or use toilets in their friends' houses. Now they are avoiding such situation.

10. A grant of Rs.50, 000 was sanctioned to Panchayat Union Primary School, Nallathechu Village, Azhiaikodi, Bhuvanagiri towards immersable water motor, purifier and furniture

The village has a population of 488 and majority of them belongs to Schedule Caste. The school has strength of 40 children. The parents have appreciated the ONGC initiative to provide water to the students and ensuring and protecting health by providing safe drinking water and improved infrastructure facilities.



11. A grant of Rs. 75,000 and Rs.52, 000 was provided to Panchayat Union Middle School Easwaran Koil, Bhuvanagiri towards Water purifier with a borewell, Compound wall, furniture and Public Address System

The total student's strength of the school is 145. Prior to construction of the compound wall there was no protection to the property of the school. Moreover, trees and plants could not be protected due to animal menace. The existing toilets were not in use due to lack of water supply. The school has to depend on water supplied by Panchayat. ONGC grant has facilitated in improving school infrastructure, ensuring consumption of protected drinking water, safeguarding school property against anti-social elements and improved confidence of children in participating in oratorical competitions using public address system.

3. Nagapattinam

1. A grant of Rs.2, 06,000 was sanctioned to Government High School, Chandrapadi, Transquobar towards school infrastructure

This School was established in the year 2003 and located at Chandrapadi Main Street. It is functioning with 11 staff members and total strength of the school is 172 (83 boys and 89 girls).

The works like tiles at Headmaster's room, computer room and science laboratory were fixed, purchased two water purifier, one steel cupboard, cycle stand within the school compound, purchased a computer and Xerox machine with accessories, one table with glass table top and one podium and welding, repairing and painting the steel cupboard and benches. The school infrastructure has improved tremendously and school environment looks tidy and neat.

2. A grant of Rs.1, 21,477 was sanctioned to TSM/TELC Primary School, Sirkali for school infrastructure

This is a 90 years old school functioning with a total students strength of 93(49 Boys and 45 Girls), located at Hospital Road, Sirkali with a Block Resource Centre of SSA. It is associated with Inclusion Education for Disabled (IED). There are 28 beneficiaries in this unit. The visible changes have been observed in schools due to ONGC interventions by increased enrolment, children staying back in school for playing and joy of learning and conducive environment for children and child friendly and one to one teaching methods by the teachers. The water and sanitation facilities have improved.

3. A grant of Rs.75, 535 was sanctioned to Singaravelar Aided Primary School, Nallathakudi, Mayilathurai towards school infrastructure

This school is situated in remote area in Myladuthurai functioning with strength of 81 children (39 are boys and 42 are girls). ONGC grant was utilized for purchase of a computer with accessories, one pedestral fan, one ceiling fan, five plastic chairs, 10 steel racks, 30 mini plastic chairs, one acquaguard filter with a capacity of 12 litres.

This support has enhanced the easy accessibility to operation and maintenance of records and other day to day functions and children are happy to use chairs and consuming safe drinking water to ensure good health

4. Financial support of Rs.1.26 lakh was sanctioned to TELC Primary School, Kuttalam towards provision of water and sanitation facilities

This school is locating at Railway Cross Road, Kuttalam with students strength of 102 children (50 boys and 52 girls).The grant has been utilized for construction of a toilet, repairing classrooms and weathering coat, white washing, obtaining separate electricity connection and compound wall. The impact of ONGC intervention is the toilets are functioning with regular water supply and protection against misuse of the school building by the miscreant.

5. A grant of Rs.3, 49,310 was sanctioned to Arumai Illam, Cholapettai, Myladuthurai towards water and infrastructure development

It is a home for senior citizens and destitute children 72 persons. The day care has 22 special children, 25 senior citizens and other inmates are 25. The ONGC grant has been utilized for purchase and installation of RO plant and renovation of kitchen and dining hall. The RO plant has ensured safe drinking water and facelift provided for kitchen and dining hall has ensured hygienic environment.

6. A grant of Rs.60, 000 to Aided Primary School, Mathirimangalam, Kuttalam towards providing water facility

The grant of Rs.60, 000 released to the school for providing water facility within the school premises has not been utilized due to the sudden demise of the school manager. The HM of the school has been asked to initiate an alternate arrangement to complete the work without further delay.

7. A grant of Rs. 3 lakhs was sanctioned to Oriental Arabic Higher Secondary School, Akkur towards school infrastructure

The school is a well established with standard infrastructure and basic amenities. Apart from ONGC grant, the school management contributed Rs 20 Lakhs towards the construction of additional new building. It is suggested that ONGC may assess the financial capacity of the institution before sanctioning grant for CSR Activity.



8. A grant of Rs. 1.75 lakh to Hope Foundation Matriculation School, Tranquobar towards school infrastructure

ONGC has granted Rs.1, 75,000 for providing furniture, uniform for the children, Baby chairs and water purifier. The grant has been effectively utilized by the school.

9. A grant of Rs. 2.25 lakh was sanctioned to Panchayat Union School, Akkaraipettai, Nagapattinam towards solid waste management

It was surprised to see that the respective Panchayat President did not initiate necessary steps for Solid Waste Management. It was expressed that the amount sanctioned is inadequate for implementing the project. He has been directed to appraise ONGC about the status and to take alternate course of action.

10. A grant of Rs. 3.90 lakh to Office of the DSP, Armed Reserve, Nagapattinam for installation of RO plant



It was observed that the fund is fully utilized with contribution from the Welfare fund of the Department and is being maintained well.

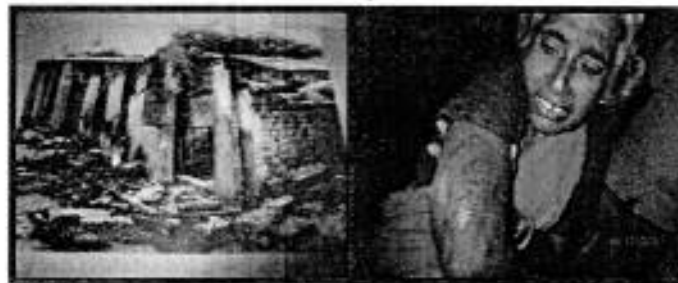
11. A grant of Rs. 4 lakh was sanctioned to the Office of the DSP, Armed Reserve, Nagapattinam towards creating Model Check Post with Digital Board, Traffic Signals, CCTV Cameras, Automatic Drop Gate, furniture, and Syntex tank.

It was observed that the facilities were provided at the targeted point and functioning well. It was found this has been useful to the Police Department in controlling and regulation of traffic.



12. Financial Assistance of Rs. 15,000/- each to 107 Fire affected families Kalaingar Nagar, Myladuthurai through District Collector

An amount of Rs.15,000/- was granted by ONGC as relief assistance to 107 Fire affected families of Kalaingar Nagar in Myladuthurai in the year 2013 through the District collector, Nagapattinam. It was observed that families have renovated and reconstructed their houses with fire proof roof by contributing their own sources also.



4. Thiruvarur

1. The grant of Rs. 3.96 lakhs sanctioned to Gandhi Peace Keeping Centre, Thiruthuraipoondi for protection of rural environment and income generation

The NGO selected 700 families from 5 Self Help Groups and distributed saplings worth Rs.1000. The package contains hybrid fruits and saplings like teak and other income yielding variety plants. The criterion adopted for the activity was that they should be SHG members and must have adequate space and water facility. The agency has fully utilised the grant.

2. Rs. 12, 49,096 was granted to V.S.Boys Higher Secondary School, Thiruvarur through Give Life Initiative Trust, Chennai

Under the programme, 100 students from economically weaker section studying between 6 - 9th standards were provided support like school bags, note books etc. In addition to this, the students were also provided with sugar and flour as supplementary nutrition. 4 staff members were made in charge of the programme by paying an honorarium of Rs. 1500/-, per month each. The programme implemented through Give Life Initiative Trust, Chennai. It was observed that there was no transparency in the programme, as the Institution felt that the fund may be sanctioned directly to the institution.

3. Grant of Rs. 2, 25,450 towards purchase of Computers, UPS and Printers by Thiruvika Government Arts College, Kidanrankondon.

The college has strength of 3500 students, out which 75 % are girls. There are 68 permanent and 40 temporary staff. The computer lab set up with the help of ONGC funds was aimed at making the library digitalised. Apart from this the students are imparted with computer training with Government recognised Diploma. The fund was effectively utilised and the students are benefitted. Further follow up is needed for sustainability of the programme.

4. Grant of Rs. 3.50 lakh was sanctioned to Vanavil Social Development Trust towards distribution of Solar Lanterns to 100 LIG families at Sunnanallur

The families are using the solar lanterns provided and the amount has been fully utilised.



5. Support for computer training centre at Armed Reserve Campus at Rs. 4 lakhs at Thiruvarur



Two types of training viz., Basic and Advanced training for the duration of 2-3 months were conducted for the benefit of children of Police personnel. The fund is effectively utilised and the students are benefitted. It is suggested that the boys and girls from other community may be imparted training instead of restricting only to the children of policy personnel.

6. Grant of Rs. 3 lakhs for construction of community hall by Adi-Dravidar Welfare Sangam, Agarathirunallur

The Institution has constructed community hall only up to lintel level due to inadequate funds. The SC population from the village would benefit from the community hall, hence it is suggested that an additional fund provision of Rs. 3 lakhs may be sanctioned for completion of the community hall by ONGC.



7. Grant of Rs. 4 lakh to Odampokkiyaru, Alivalam Vaikkal President, Pasanatharar Sabai for construction of "A" Class Channel of 5 kms

The channel is being used for irrigation and the farmers have donated a portion of their lands and get compensation annually from ONGC. The fund has been effectively utilised.

8. Grant of Rs. 2.50 lakh to Panchayat President, Samaankulam, Akkaraikottakam towards construction of retaining wall

The villages viz., Angadi colony, Thiruvasal Panniyur, Kulamanickam, Sammankulam and Melakulam SC colony have been benefitted by the construction retaining wall, Bore well with mini power pump, bathing ghat etc. The villages are fully utilising the services provided.

5. Thiruvallur District

1. A grant of Rs. 1 lakh was sanctioned to the Revenue Division Office, Ponneri TK Thiruvallur District towards purchase of water purifier, computer systems and furniture

It was revealed that the cheque has been issued in the name of the RDO, which has not been permitted as per Government rules. Hence, the items have not been purchased. It is suggested that ONGC may verify with the concerned departments the name of the authorized institution or person for issue of cheque prior to sanction.

2. A grant of Rs. 2 lakh was released to the Project Officer, District Rural Development Agency towards construction of ICDS building at New Gummidipoondi under Self Sufficient Scheme

The work has not been completed due to delay in tender procedures. It was assured to complete the work before March 2015. ONGC may follow up and monitor the activity as schedule.

3. A grant of Rs. 66,250 was sanctioned to Government Higher Secondary School, Maduravoyal towards installation of decorative gate.

The Govt. School has strength of 1249 students. The students belong to families of marginalized category. Earlier entrance to the school was very narrow. Mrs. Nirmala the headmistress of the school informed that the students found it very difficult to enter the school premises and teachers had to regulate the students at



the entrance both in the morning and evening times. Their bicycles had to be parked outside. The Headmistress made a request for the installation of a gate to facilitate the entry of the students without difficulty under the CSR Assistance from ONGC, the gate was installed which gave a facelift to the school.

The students felt that the installation of the gate had facilitated them to enter and leave the school without difficulty.

4. A grant of Rs. 9, 07,655 was sanctioned to Anbumalar Special School, Paushkanpet, Gnayur towards purchase of a Tempo traveller



The special school provides education to mentally challenged children in the age groups of 3-16 years. The special credit to the institution is that it is located in a rural area and caters its services to the special children from villages. But for this school, the 55 special children had to be sent to the

Chennai for the training which is impossible in many cases due to economic backwardness. The institution has been recognized by Govt. of Tamil Nadu to run the special school. There are 3 special teachers, one physiotherapist and 3 helpers. Other corporate had provided (CPCL) vocational training equipments (Paper cup machine). The school is located in a sprawling area. One of helper's 16 years old daughters is studying in the school. She informed that there is improvement in her behavior after joining he school (since 4 years). The school bus visits the villages and brings the children in the morning and leaves them in the evening. There is also another bus owned by institution which is not in working condition.

5. A grant of Rs.2.96 lakh was sanctioned to Government Higher Secondary School for Boys, Arani, Tiruvallur District towards provision of water filter, sintex water tanks, computer and furniture

The school is located in a rural atmosphere. The school provides education upto class XII and the strength of students is 1184. Two children's belongs to marginal group. ONGC has provided 3 computers, 2 sintex water purifiers and furniture. The students are consuming protected drinking water, computers facilitates in improving their knowledge in computer operations for 11th and 12th standards.



6. A grant of Rs. 2.49 lakh was sanctioned to All Women Rural Development Society, Melnathur village for imparting 6 months training in computers

The institution is working for the development of women and children by implementing various socio-economic programmes. The institution had been approved by Government of Tamil Nadu for promotion of SHGs through NABARD. The institution had trained 30 women belonging to Dalit families in



computer training for 6 months. As the institution is a recognized by Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi for job oriented vocational training courses. The institution has infrastructure facilities, equipment, spacious building and qualified staff to conduct the programme.

The institution had also conducted one month computer training programme for 30 candidates mostly from rural areas during 2013-2014. It was found that the trained candidates are employed in departmental stores, Private establishments and offices with minimum salary of Rs.7, 000/- p.m. During the interaction with the beneficiaries of the 2nd batch, they informed that some of the beneficiaries are undergoing advanced course in computer for better job opportunities.

7. A grant of Rs. 4 lakh was sanctioned to Dr.Ambedkar Ashram School Nemanallur, Gummidipoondi towards purchase of 2 tier cots and benches

The institution provides education with institutional care to 100 children belong to Irulas community. But for this school, the children would have become child labourers in Bricklin industry, farm work or even become victims of child trafficking. The school has been receiving fund from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India and Tamil Nadu.

ONGC CSR assistance was utilized to provide 2 tier cots, benches and fans. It was observed that the design of the 2 tier cots are not suitable for this young children due to lack of ladders to climb and not safe for children to sleep in upper tier. Hence, the cots are not used by the institution and kept in a corner and untidy. It is suggested that ONGC may assess prior to sanction of such assistance.

6. ARIYALUR

1. Livelihood support of Rs. 1.32 lakh was extended to a SHG group in Periyavalayam village and Panchayat, Udayarpalayam Taluk in 2011-12

The activity has not yet been started due to requirement of a separate electricity (III phase) which could not be obtained from TNEB so far. The machineries have been purchased and kept idle in a room. Mr.Chitrarasu (ph.no.9965682906) who is the husband of Mrs.Senthilselvi, President is only the spokesperson for the activity. The reason for not starting the flour mill is not justified as it was funded in 2011-2012.It was found that there is already a flour mill run by a woman entrepreneur in the same village. When the President of the Jeyankondam Town Panchayat, Mr.Selvaraj (ph .no.9865647105) was contacted, he was not aware of such livelihood programme funded by ONGC in the village Periyapalayam. It is requested that ONGC may take action to expedite the activity.

2. School infrastructure facilities like Tables, Benches, Cupboard and computer sanctioned to Panchayat Union Primary School at Guruvallappar Koil, Jayamkondam at a cost of Rs.68,000/-



The total strength of the school is 54 children (26 boys and 28 girls), of which more than 80 per cent of them belong to Scheduled caste. The school has 3 staff members. The water and sanitation facilities viz.,, one common toilet, 2 urinals and water supply through pipelines has

been available. The furniture and computer have been purchased by the school from ONGC grant. The furniture purchased is suitable only for grown up children and hence very few are used and the rest are kept idle. It is suggested that ONGC may divert the unused furniture to the deserving schools in consultation with Education Department and in future stipulate certain norms prior to funding such projects.

3. School Infrastructure Development to Panchayat Union Elementary School, Chinnavalayam at a cost of Rs. 2.75 lakh

The school has strength of 100 children (60 boys and 40 girls) which has been managed by 5 staff members. The school has 6 classrooms. ONGC provided grant for construction of toilet units with water facility from borewell. The school is well maintained. The ONGC funding has improved toilet usage and the school environment looks clean and children are avoiding using open space for urinating.
